The following reports were received:

- IASB Mr. Cerniglia reported he attended the North Cook Division Fall Dinner and Meeting on October 21st. Dr. Beth Purvis, Illinois Secretary of Education, was the speaker. She talked about her role of collaborating with and directing the 12 state agencies. There was also an opportunity for questions and answers.
- ED RED Ms. Mallek said the draft model of the State funding formula was reviewed. Ms. Mallek was part of a subgroup that examined the developing model and provided input to be shared with legislators.
- ABC/25 Foundation Ms. Ryerson reported a grant-writing workshop was held October 1st in partnership with Tech 25. All grants were due November 2nd. Eighty-four applications for the Karen Wessel Bar Teacher Grant were received and 31 applications for the Marian Elliott Excellence in Education Teacher Grant. All nine schools have representatives to read and score the grants. Currently, eight of the nine district schools have qualified for the \$2,500 membership incentive grants.

Student Learning

E-Rate – Internet Safety Information

Mr. Fahnoe said Internet safety information is the focus for staff and students throughout the year. It is incorporated into school curriculum and taught at least once each school year. Safe, appropriate use of the Internet is promoted to students. Staff talk to students about the risks of sharing personal information, recognizing and reporting online harassment and cyber-bullying, copyright laws, and digital citizenship. Information also includes knowing which resources to use. Staff use the acronym THINK meaning True; Helpful, Inspiring, Necessary, Kind, to help guide students to be thoughtful digital citizens.

Website Redesign

Mr. Fahnoe reported plans are underway to redesign the district website. Mr. Fahnoe is looking for a platform to increase access to layouts and apps, work well on mobile devices, and provide an easy platform for staff and department content pages. They are looking for a modern design that is interactive. Changing website design will take time and staff will be provided with training. Mr. Fahnoe said they will field test the new website, looking for feedback, accessibility, and ease of use. Board members suggested Mr. Fahnoe receive input from parents.

Workers' Compensation Insurance Renewal 2016

Ms. Mallek presented information on renewals for workers' compensation insurance. The increase in premium is minimal. A motion will be brought to the Board at the next meeting.

Employee Benefits Renewal 2016

Ms. Mallek noted information regarding employee benefits renewal for 2016 was presented at the November 19th meeting. She said there were no changes to the previously presented information.

Award of Security Camera Bid

Ms. Mallek said security cameras were part of the capital projects approved last January. The district put the item out to bid and bids were opened November 9th. She is recommending the lowest bidder. A grant will cover 50% of the total cost

reimbursement for this project. Security cameras will be replaced at South and Thomas Middle Schools.

Strategic Planning Update

Dr. Bein said that in 2007 the district embarked on a strategic planning process developing *Vision 2020*, the *WIRED Framework*, and *Goals*. We are now halfway through and would like to revisit the original process. We will work with Ana Weselak from Weselak & Associates. The multi-layered process will be inclusive and transparent. It will include an online survey, committee and subcommittee work developing objectives and an action plan, review of the draft, and presentation to the Board and community. Committee work is expected to begin in January with presentation for adoption in May or June 2016. Board members suggested the process look ahead more than five years. One member recalled the Board had been given a Gary Marx book prior to the 2007 strategic planning process and felt it created a common starting point of understanding as they began the process.
